<b>Community Forums</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• First Forum was very successful with many Community Leaders in attendance. Many positive remarks in regards to the speakers. Already seeing positive outcomes. Funding has been obtained for the “Warm Hand-off” program.</li> <li>• Next Forum will be held on June 21, 2017 for local Business Leaders. Tracy Stute is working on securing Grace Lutheran as the location. It will be a lunch time session, 11:30 to 1:30</li> <li>• The forum will still include Busting the Myths and will contain a component focusing on Employer Hiring Practices in regards to those with drug addiction and prevention/help for those already employed. Touch on pain medication leading to addiction.</li> <li>• Mental Health Foundation Grant will provide \$5,000.00 in funding for the forums. Spring donation letters are going out soon and Mental Health will match up to \$2,500.00 of what is collected. <b>Coalition Website</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Please send any community data you have available to Carey McKee for the website (please forward to Wendy for use in the forum presentations).</li> <li>• Michelle Adkins shared that in 2016 there were 154 babies born that had a positive drug screen with 13 of those born in withdrawal. Stats will be added to website.</li> </ul>	

<p><b>Conversation for Change and Community Events</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Dr. Bashir distributed Conversation for Change post cards. Please hand out to any client or community partner as appropriate. More awareness is needed. Please let Dr. Bashir know if you need more post cards. (Copy attached)</li> <li>• 43 individuals have attended Conversation for Change to date. There has been a lot of positive feedback from those who have utilized the program.</li> <li>• Grant for \$1000.00 submitted and renewal was awarded.</li> <li>• The local Conversation for Change needs more Law Enforcement involvement to help bridge relationships. DEA may work with SPD to fund officer present.</li> <li>• Conversation for Change, through Agent Ashley, has internal grants for materials, could print post cards (they would need to be generic), other program related material or purchase giveaway items. Cannot be used for food.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Drug Death Report</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• In lieu of Dr. Marsh's drug death review report, Wendy shared that from January 1, 2017; to April 28, 2017 there have been approximately 60 unconfirmed drug overdose deaths. David Ashley shared his concern that the new law limiting opioid pain medication script to 7 days will cause an increase in the number of individual seeking heroin and fentanyl leading to even more overdoses.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Community Data</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Official start date to be determined, funding for May and June in place. Warm Hand-off staffing is in place but still need a safe house. Staffing will cost \$133,000.00 per year. Staffing will be 24/7 and consist of 3 full time and 3 part-time (weekends only) employees which will be a combination of counselors, therapist, peer counselors.</li> <li>• Detox protocol is in place in our local hospital and is being followed, but where do we take them from there.</li> <li>• It is imperative that our community has the right resources immediately accessible or we will lose those we are trying to help. Could there be collaboration with Dayton or Franklin County for safe house admittance? Could there be collaboration with Cornerstone, 24 hour phone access for hospital/first responders/Law Enforcement; so that patient(s) can be placed until treatment can start.</li> <li>• An area congregation has offered a donation; house? This in turn could be turned into a safe house. Could house 5 at a time without rezoning.</li> <li>• Refuge is a recovery program in Franklin County: This is a faith based program for men with three locations. They will take new patients/clients on Monday mornings. A group from Springfield is taken over each week; phone number for local contact is 937-605-0085(see attached business card for further contact information). Wendy will make arrangements to visit and obtain information.</li> <li>• Fire Stations in Manchester Massachusetts are allowing those who have detoxed a safe place to stay, on a short term basis, until they are able to get into/on treatment. Wendy will contact Mike Cooper to make inquiries about this program since he has already researched for article. Also to speak with local fire station to see if this is something that can be done here.</li> <li>• Speak with our local Fire Department(s) once more information is available.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Youth</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• More prevention and support programs are needed for our youth.</li> <li>• Task Force sub-group needs to address the youth needs and to research youth related prevention programs.</li> </ul>	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Botvin – McKinley Board is looking at, CCCHD shared that the Mental Health Task Force is also interested in Botvin and has gotten it into two middle schools this fall with a third potentially coming on board. They are also working on expanding PAX Good Behavior program. Wendy to contact Sandy Miller/Nic Heimlich to discuss partnering/collaboration on these projects.</li> <li>• Need Children of Addicts Support Group(s)</li> <li>• David Ashley recommended three programs geared to Youth: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Chasing the Dragon: High School Level – 1 hour video, with a follow-up panel by DEA, FBI, Federal Prosecutors office and local representatives.</li> <li>✓ DEA Dance Program: After School dance program in which students in 4<sup>th</sup> – 7<sup>th</sup> grade can participate in a drug prevention dance curriculum. Cost: \$24.00 donation for one child to attend the 10 week program or a \$5,350.00 donation will pay for the entire program for a year at a school, including scholarships and instructor training. .</li> <li>✓ Operation Prevention: Middle/High School Curriculum: Free middle/high school program that has classroom resources, virtual field trip, video, challenge and parent toolkit.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• HOPE – support group for youth who are already abusing drugs and/or alcohol. Need to add drug prevention materials/information. Could mandated participation for youth seen through the courts for drug/alcohol offences be initiated?</li> <li>• Children are People is a support group for children of addicts that facilitated by McKinley Hall. Could this group be re-formed?</li> </ul>	
<b>Recovery House</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Celebrating Recovery House event is set for May 23, 2017, starting at 6:30 PM. The event will be held at Grace Lutheran on St Paris Pike. Corina distributed flyers for the event. See attached handout.</li> <li>• Recovery House is a 24/7 facility for both men and women and can accommodate 8 of each at a time. They must be 2 weeks clean. Area congregations help to finance housing until they can enter Recovery House. The program has three phases: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Phase 1 is intense with a counselor/mentor.</li> <li>2. Phase 2 is job securement, maintaining mentor contact, taught life skills, continues in treatment.</li> <li>3. Phase 3 is the transitional process.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• Boots on the Ground – group buys houses, fixes them up and sell to families in recovery at a low cost, no interest and often paid off within 4 years. This allows for a fresh start for those who are successful, keeping them out of an environment where they may relapse.</li> </ul>	
<b>Grant Opportunity</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• David Ashley DEA will be submitting a grant in July that if awarded would pay for a public media campaign, for example billboard(s), public service announcements</li> <li>• If recent grant submission is approved/awarded some of the monies can be used to purchase Botvin.</li> </ul>
