It does not matter if they are currently in treatment or not. Family members are welcome and will receive NARCAN training. Currently SPD and EMS are distributing business cards with information for this program to those they come into contact while providing services to the community. These cards have also been distributed at various locations throughout Clark County, including Drake Hotel, Interfaith and many others. Springfield News Sun is running article supporting Conversation for Change as well as articles regarding the addiction epidemic. Coroner's Report	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 78 Fatal Overdoses with 52 confirmed. • See more Fentanyl variant 	
Community Data Update	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Suboxone may be added to panel when testing newborns for drugs. Fentanyl will be part of screening within the next two months. • Marijuana is not currently screened for through the birthing unit; however, there is evidence that it is now being laced with Fentanyl, as is Cocaine. Screening may need to be expanded. • 489 EMS runs for overdoses • 20 referrals have been make • 452 SPD/Sheriff overdose response • 39% of those with a non-fatal overdose are now in treatment. • McKinley Hall reported 288 Narcan kits distributed, 18 reversals • Warm Handoff and Safe House are now funded through CARA Act Funds for the next 12 months. Wendy is looking for a house to buy that will accommodate up to 5 clients. Evidence Based Education Goal	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Botvin has been chosen and will be trialed in two county schools in the fall of 2017, Tecumseh MS and Miami View. • Well Spring will be managing program 	
General Discussion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Additional outreach suggestions – Dan Martin suggested presenting to the City Commission during a work session and having it filmed and shown on the local public TV. Also the County Commissioners are interested in helping and have been invited to the task force. Both have the potential to be influential in the community. • Mike Cooper, Springfield News Sun, has being doing stories in the paper to show there can be and is successful recoveries. • Nick Heimlich shared that there are some preliminary discussion about treating overdoses less aggressively by using low level resuscitation measures. This would involve using Narcan to revive to the level of stabilization, but still in need of care. This would also facilitate a better Warm Handoff. There is a long ways to go before implementing, such as, redefining responsiveness, new protocol in place to protect first responders and patients, more real time data is needed, research what is being used in other communities that are defining these types of 	

	<p>procedures/protocols. While this practice is not yet established as evidence based or best practice it is a promising avenue of investigation/research.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There is a need to train more individuals to present/educate so that the responsibility does not fall on just a couple of people. • Tony suggested forming a Training Committee and volunteered to be part of group but needs volunteers to join him. This group would reach out to local churches, school superintendents, and other groups to educate them on the resources available in our community for anyone they come into contact with that is in need of treatment/recovery services. This outreach could be conducted as a Town Hall type meeting with a 20 minute presentation including the resources available and a 10 minute video that is a Thank you to EMS and Law Enforcement. • An addict has to be ready but the resources have to be ready and available also. 	
<p>Grant and/or Funding Opportunities</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DEA Agent David Ashley is submitting Conversation for Change Grant application to fund 8 events between Montgomery and Clark County • 2018 grant is more competitive • Grant submission, by June 29th, to fund Community Strengthening Coalition building a 5K event. If awarded and we decide not to go through with the event the monies will be returned. • MHR Board's spring campaign is to benefit the Substance Abuse Task Force/Coalition. The donations will be used to fund the Forums. \$4,605 has been collected to date and the Recovery Board will match. • Springfield Foundation is looking to pull together funding to finance a Coalition Coordinator.
