<p>Death Review Team Update/Coroner's Report</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 81 suspected, 63 confirmed unintended drug overdose deaths to date for 2017. • Drug death review team met – extensive work on database. Jessica Hamilton, CCCHD EPI, is doing a great job on the database work. • Overdose deaths are down significantly from the first quarter of 2017. EMS are seeing fewer overdoses. Possible reasons: Fear, Recent Arrests, Supplies, Peer Education. There has been 3-4 weeks of significant reduction in overdoses. • Coroner is submitting a grant proposal to ODH for monies to update technology, Enhance Information Management System. The grant deadline is August 18, 2017 at 4:00 PM. Dr. Marsh has requested help in writing the grant.

Reviewed Coalition work plan as a group. • Need a broad perspective – News media focused on numbers, Mike Cooper doing a great job with articles, but we need to share what we are doing – more media coverage with the focus being more on successes (positive message) and good intentions instead of numbers and negative reinforcement. Approach Mike Cooper, to ask if he would do one success focused article a month. • Does the community know we have a coalition? Use Facebook and Instagram to get the word out to multiple population sectors. • Everyone needs to be engaged and involved, not just the sub-committee members. • Coalition needs a coordinator to help organize us. Tony Baily offered to create monthly video blasts to instruct/inform. 5-10 minutes each, utilize social media as a source for distribution. ✓ Data Sub-Committee: Michelle Adkins, Dr. Marsh, Lisa (?).We need broader spectrum of the data. Could enlist the assistance of a Wittenberg Hagen Center student to help with data. SRMC intern to help with data also. Uses and suggestions for monies: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Allows for increase in the number of Forums held. ✓ Suggested that we use the Dome for events to save monies for other purposes. ✓ Allows for the addition of paid speakers. ✓ \$2,000 allotted for print materials. ✓ \$2,500 for professional services – ½ day facilitation of strategic planning. ✓ Dr. Juliano suggested using monies for Youth Education. Could help to offset the cost of facilitators and facilitator training for Botvin program. 	

	<p>Currently in two schools, Tecumseh MS and Miami View. The program must be administered by teacher/school staff that has undergone the training. Training costs \$1,300 for 2 full days. Limited to 10-12 staff at a time. Wellspring is trained and hopes to become technical advisors to school staff or clinical staff.
