Benefit/potential of successful recoveries.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Need more data on the youth – look at 2017 YRBS results once data available. Data utilization to support more prevention, better messaging, and education on recognition of signs of OD.</li> <li>If the coalition or its members need death data please contact Dr. Marsh. The coroner’s office received the grant for the new database. Database provides better tracking. Suggested that current data linked to the coalition website. Community Initiatives/Needs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Need: Mental Health component is insufficient to meet the needs of our community, especially the youth. More resources are needed. History of trauma needs more intervention programs/initiatives. Suggested that the coalition speak with Kurt Gillespie about what they have for children. Schools refer to CAFC, nothing in the schools, definite gap.</li> <li>• Needs of our community's children: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Grief Recovery for children is especially lacking. Rob R. shared information about a program that was piloted in Schaffer MS that was very effective. Relied upon male volunteers to support/listen to the children. Used journaling and shared grief stories.</li> <li>✓ We need more volunteers to devote time and fill gaps. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Risk of overdose for young children has increased dramatically in recent times. Those &lt;5 are being overdosed by their parents drugs and paraphernalia. 4 children in Clark County have been revived with Narcan as of September 2017.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> <li>• Catholic Central utilizes 3 of City Connects Counselors. One for K-2 one for 3-6 and one for 7-12. They provide grief counseling. Catholic Central is planning for permanency of counselors. Need is very data driven, every child is reviewed/screened for need.</li> <li>• Community initiatives: Drug Free Workforce Technological Assistance Training. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Working Partners: Drug Free Workforce, OH MHS</li> <li>✓ Program was targeted to Springfield; initially 5 local businesses participated.</li> <li>✓ Business data over an 8-9 month time period was collected including concerns of employers.</li> <li>✓ Drug Free Workforce technological Assistance Training was offer to local employers at the Business Forum held in June 2017. 18 expressed interest.</li> <li>✓ Recovery Board proposed getting more funding so MHRB has been able to extend the trainings.</li> <li>✓ 4 local businesses attended the second round of Drug Free Workforce Technological Assistance Training.</li> <li>✓ Navistar and Assurant are interested in attending the next round.</li> <li>✓ 2-3 additional employers will be sought out to train the next round as well.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

<b>Discussion/Other</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• McKinley Hall held their annual Recovery Banquet on August the 21<sup>st</sup>. Formally recognized Michael Cooper, Springfield News Sun, for his support and coverage of addiction in our community.</li> <li>• Support is critical to recovery. The highest drop off occurs between 6-9 months into recovery. Those who are successful in recovery site that safe housing and peer support as significant contributing factors.</li> <li>• Social Services 101 has asked Wendy to present on Addiction a Brain Disease.</li> <li>• Reminder of breakfast event with Ohio Attorney General Mike DeWine on October 25<sup>th</sup>. Registration is required along with payment.</li> <li>• Safe House has now been open 2 weeks – 3 ODs brought in, however, none occurred between 3 and 11 PM, so the system has not yet been fully tested.</li> <li>• If appears that the number of overdoses has decreased.</li> <li>• Mr. Ward shared information from his meeting with Bob Hackett: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Sees need for criminal justice modification.</li> <li>✓ State unable to be supportive on a large scale at this time.</li> <li>✓ Thought that asking faith based for support instead of the state may be a viable option (it is too much to ask of the faith based community to take on a large scale).</li> <li>✓ In favor of hybrid approaches.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Rick Jones is doing a very good job of determining how the new Community Center will be utilized and how it can provide the most benefit to those it will service.</li> <li>• Tony reminded members of the upcoming DEA 360 event at the Nutter</li> </ul>
