Social Media Update	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Shayne Gray presented information and examples of the new system the county has purchased which contains a section on the opioid epidemic. John Federer has agreed to allow staff to work on the opioid epidemic related mapping. The program can be utilized to create maps that show where treatment facilities are located and when clicked on can provide detailed information. Also includes drop off site information and can be expanded to include other potential beneficial data such as pain management sites, education tools, story maps where individuals/families can share their stories of loss or recovery to bring it home to our community and to gather statistical data. A link to this site would be added to the Coalitions existing website. The Coalition needs to supply the data to be represented on the mapping site and would also need to relay updates to Shayne or designee in a timely manner. The Data Committee will be working directly with Shayne. Dr. Marsh stated that this would be a great opportunity.

Lisa D'allessandris has sent out a request for data survey and only received one response to date. The request will be re-sent and you may reply directly to her or through the google documents link. She and the other members of the Data Committee will review and vet the data. Lisa will past any relevant data to Shayne for inclusion on the mapping website. The rest of the data will be utilized in planning and funding efforts.

A presentation was also made to the Kreider Corporation. 	
<p>Death Review Team Update – Coroner’s Report</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 105 suspected unintentional drug overdose deaths to date in 2017 • 6 were not drug related, 86 have been confirmed and the rest are pending. • It is anticipated that there will be in excess of 100 drug overdose deaths for 2017. The number of confirmed deaths for 2017 has already exceeded the 2016 total. • The number of drug overdoses started to slow down between June and July. 1st quarter 91, 2nd quarter 75, 3rd quarter 36. There continues to be small spikes but not the numbers seen in the 1st quarter. • Dr. Marsh reported that with the new database the coroner's office is using, other agencies would be able to enter data, edit data or update information for themselves, but would only be able to view the data from other agencies. This could be a good way to clean up the databases on an ongoing basis.

<p>Drug Disposal Bags</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 189 Bags have been distributed to 14 pharmacies and 4 doctor’s offices. • More cards needed to be produced to staple to the bags. The decision was made to add drop box addresses to the informational cards. 	
<p>Grant Opportunity</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cardinal Health has grants available and Dr. Bashir is applying for two of them: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Prevention for Youth – \$25,000 to \$35,000 ✓ Community Level Response - \$75,000 to \$100,000 ✓ Due date is January 12th. • Dr. Ward inquired about the availability of monies, potentially \$20,000, for video project, if grant awarded. Huma to check to see if this is a possibility, but will need objectives for planning. Dr. Ward to send. • Dr. Bashir is also looking for other grant opportunities as well as revisiting past grant opportunities. • Attorney General’s Office is providing funding to support Botvin along with or in place of DARE with the current DARE officers implementing/teaching.

This helps employers set guidelines for 2nd chances, hiring those with a criminal record for

If you have a personal/professional relationship with any local employers please refer them to this program. ✓ Navistar and Assurant are considering. 	
<p>Botvin Prevention Program</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Update by Leslie Crew: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Botvin is now in two Clark County schools: Tecumseh Middle School and Miami View. ✓ Catholic Central and Greenon have signed on to start in fall of 2018. ✓ Also interested is Tecumseh Elementary, Northeastern and Clark Shawnee. 	
<p>Discussion/Other</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dr. Ward is reaching out to local schools in an effort to start grief groups in schools. There is a definite interest. Pathway for Hope to facilitate the meetings. • Emma Smales shared that Ohio Injury Prevention Partnership has a large opioid subgroup. Also there are many grants available through the partnership including a Project DAWN (Death Avoidance With Narcan) grant. The full group meets quarterly and the workgroups use conference calls for meeting. If you are interested you can go to their website and fill out a form to receive e-mail notifications. The group is also part of ODH's Take Charge Ohio Campaign, which is a media campaign focused on prescription drugs. You can also access a tool to evaluate risk for addiction for those taking prescription drugs. • Rick Jones Update: the 501C3 has been adopted and approved for the Community Center. Addresses addiction, re-entry and all stages of family impact. Additionally, there is a Faith Based Re-entry Conference coming up. January 27th there will be a job fair. Also, there is an upcoming meeting with Mike Daves regarding Court Referrals. • FOA Toy Drive for Interfaith will be held December 6, 2017 from 6:00 to 8:00. They are up to approximately 34 children in residents who are in need of a Merry Christmas. These children range in age from infant to 17 years.
