<p>Community Collective Impact Model for Change (CCIM4C)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CCIM4C is a data driven process. Grant funding has been received to support the work involved. Currently 1 year planning process is covered. • The end goal is to reduce opioid use and the number of related deaths. • The grant deliverables are due by the end of April. • This process includes 6 strategic road maps, with a focus on contribution factors to the overall problem. • Involves a lot of work in a very short period of time. • Round two of funding will be for implementation. • Need to utilize the Substance Abuse Data Committee, process requires data informed decision making. • Tracey needs a smaller representation of the coalition to be a leadership team and to invest some intensive time to the process. Asking for 6-8 individuals to volunteer. This group will provide feedback to the full task force/coalition.
