Needle Exchange Initiative	 Natalie Hall, Communicable Disease Nurse, Anna Petroff, EPI, and Kelly from McKinley Hall visited Montgomery County's Needle Exchange Program to see logistically how it operated. Needles are exchanged 1 for 1, Testing is offered including HIV and Hep C. They also have an insurance navigator present to assist client in signing up for insurance coverage. Narcan kits are distributed along with training on use. It is important to create a space where the clients feel safe and it is vital to be non-judgmental and develop trust. Natalie Hall will present to the Board of Health on June 21st. The board must be in support of the program, however, the health department will not oversee the program. The prosecutor must clear the program in order to proceed. Charles Patterson is also requesting to speak with the local Board of Drug, Alcohol and Mental Health. The Ohio revised code states all these individuals must be consulted prior to starting the program. We need their support to be successful. This initiative ultimate focus is Harm Reduction by providing links to treatment and care. It is a point of intervention. Location is still being determined. The desired location is the new Community Center, but further discussion is needed and legalities addressed. McKinley Hall is always an option but may not be ideal location.
