<b>General Discussion</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Update: We are in year two of the Community Health Improvement Plan and are having meetings now for input for community health assessment. The data from the assessment and the regional hospital are going to be collated and done by January 1, 2019. We will take that data along with the Youth Risk Behavior Survey and other local data by March and should be able to have other community meetings with the public before it's published.</li> </ul>	
<b>Congestive Heart Failure</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>January 18, 2018 – May 30, 2018 RHC has had a total of 9 CHF patients referred from SRMC. There has been a few no-shows. The average time between discharge and appointments is about 5 ½ days. Number of appointments kept were 16 total. Out of the patients above, there have been zero re-admissions due to CHF.</li> <li>If patients are unable to be reached CCCHD will help reach out to these individuals.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>RHC to continue to receive referrals and continue care with those patients.</li> </ul>
<b>Diabetes</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>RHC has had a total of 2 diabetic referrals from Springfield Regional since January 1, 2018.</li> <li>It was noted that there were 5 miscellaneous referrals.</li> <li>ADA Certification – RHC is hoping to submit the application today to be ADA certified.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>RHC to continue to receive referrals and continue care with those patients.</li> </ul>
<b>Asthma</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Nurse meeting was well attended and Dayton Children's provided the speakers. It was noted that there will be another meeting in the fall but has not been scheduled at this time.</li> <li>School curriculum for elementary and middle school has been reviewed and presented one at possum school.</li> <li>Visited 45 patients so far and results have been great!</li> <li>ODH reviewed asthma pamphlet and has changed the format slightly.</li> <li>Data was reviewed by the Epidemiologist and it was noted that the African American males and Caucasian adult females are the target for asthma.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Anne to continue to assess asthma homes and follow up with patients.</li> <li>Anne to deliver revised pamphlet to RHC and SRMC</li> </ul>

They wanted and enforcement plan but do not want to put on law enforcements plate</li> <li>• Smoke free multi housing should be complete by June and must be in effect by August.</li> <li>• STAND – completed 48 store audits and 96% of stores sold e-cigarettes.</li> <li>• Completed 11 compliance checks and no stores sold to minors.</li> <li>• Finalizing the counter marketing activity – spent \$1,000 on Facebook Post (reached 80,000 people in Clark County)</li> <li>• FY19 grant will have separate funding for Springfield and New Carlisle.</li> <li>•</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Marcy to complete more on site education classes.</li> <li>• The plan is to create a smoking cessation group for Clark County.</li> </ul>
