Congestive Heart Failure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Referral numbers have been down. RCH has seen 2 referrals since January 2019. - Michelle stated the heart failure clinic is to help manage patients between RCH and SRMC. This is located in the same building as the imaging center on the second floor. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Lisa to continue to follow up with SRMC (Missy) to speak about possible barriers on referrals. - Marianne to follow up on SRMC referrals for re-admits.
Diabetes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - RCH has had 3 referrals since January 2019 and 5 miscellaneous referrals. - RHC is in the process of updating continuing education credits for the employees listed under the ADA certification. They must have 15 CEU’s per person per year. Still have \$700 left from the Clark Campaign Diabetes Association to help pay for renewals. - RHC submitting application to ODH for a pilot program to try and detect hypertension and pre-diabetics early. - New Carlisle diabetes support group has been averaging between 6 and 12 people. Community enjoyed the vendors who participated and received a lot of feedback. - Dayton Children’s Medical center opened up a food pantry on the bottom floor of the hospital and Doctors prescribe food for individuals that may have diabetes or are pre-diabetic. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Michelle, Lisa, and Andrea to continue to work on getting an ADA site in New Carlisle. - Lisa to inform group of how many participants participated in the education through the ADA site. - Group to look at how to partner with local food banks to help clients choose healthier options and to ensure food banks are consistent with food choices.

Oral Health	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Oral Health Coilition meeting today April 12th at RCH at noon. - Community Health Foundation is making their 3rd donation of \$50,000 to the RHC dental clinic. - \$6,300 donation from Wilson Sheehan Foundation for bilingual books. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Continue to work with Early Childhood providers on an education program.
Tobacco	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Tecumseh High School is now a 100% tobacco free environment. - Cessation – working with Marcy at Mercy Reach - Applied for a CHF grant to provide cessation classes free of cost (New Carlisle and Springfield). - Tobacco grant requires letters of support for the upcoming year. Emma suggested one of those should be coming from the Chronic Disease Task Force that states that we are willing to work on tobacco issues moving forward. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Andrea to work with Shawnee in the next fiscal grant year to become a 100% tobacco free environment.
