*Individuals 40 years and older

*Individuals with a [severe congenital, developmental or early onset disorder](#).

○ Qualifying Conditions

- Cerebral palsy
- Spina bifida
- Inherited metabolic disorders including phenylketonuria
- Severe neurological disorders including epilepsy, hydrocephaly, and microcephaly
- Severe genetic disorders including Down syndrome, fragile X syndrome, Prader-Willi syndrome, Turner syndrome, and muscular dystrophy
- Cystic fibrosis; sickle cell anemia; and alpha and beta thalassemia
- Solid organ transplant recipients and candidates
- Type 1 Diabetes
- Type 2 Diabetes
- Pregnant Individuals
- Bone Marrow Transplant recipients
- ALS
- End stage Renal Disease
- Cancer
- Obesity
- COPD
- Chronic Kidney Disease
- Heart Disease

○ Qualifying Conditions - -

IF HOSPITALIZATION WAS REQUIRED WITHIN THE PAST YEAR

- Severe congenital heart disease **requiring hospitalization within the past year**

- Severe lung disease, including asthma **requiring hospitalization within the past year**

Still scheduling for eligible individuals in phase 1A:

- Congregate care residents and staff, and nursing homes or assisted living facilities not enrolled in the federal long-term care pharmacy program at the same time vaccinations are continue for Phase 1B
