<b>Task Force Members Present</b>	S. Dahlinghaus, A. Kaup-Fett, M. Ivory  C. Parker (Guest), K. Adams (Guest)	
<b>Task Force Structure</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>S. Dahlinghaus shared that the Tobacco Task Force will now operate within the Chronic Disease Task Force due to overlapping data and need.</li> </ul>	
<b>Discuss Quitline Operation</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>M. Ivory shared that the Quitline only accepts referrals who are pregnant, receive Medicaid, have no insurance or are a partner with ODH.</li> <li>C. Parker refers eligible clients to Quitline</li> <li>The Quitline calls the clients once a week for 5 weeks, sends a packet of info including a 2 week supply of gum or lozenges and helps the client set a quit date.</li> <li>A. Kaup-Fett proposed finding a way to fund a local quitline as a future initiative</li> <li>The group decided to eliminate the Quitline as a possible intervention at this time</li> </ul>	
<b>Review Data</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The group reviewed the data compiled by G. Jones.</li> <li>The group decided to remove “veterans” from our list of possible interventions, due to lack of supporting data</li> </ul>	
<b>Tobacco21</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>S. Dahlinghaus introduced Tobacco21 as a new initiative: raising purchase age to 21</li> <li>A. Kaup-Fett suggested reaching out to Karen Duncan as possible government support</li> <li>After more information is obtained, the group will contact other Ohio cities who have passed Tobacco21 for guidance.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ S. Dahlinghaus will forward all Tobacco21 documents to members for review</li> <li>✓ S. Dahlinghaus will contact Tobacco21 regional director for technical assistance on getting started</li> </ul>
<b>Baby &amp; Me Tobacco Free</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>C. Parker described the program: CFHS grant funded program for pregnant and smoking mothers. Free to participants. Once enrolled, the moms get 25 minutes of education, test CO level. Post Natal – Follow for a year via phone calls/incentives, if they complete the program they receive a diaper voucher.</li> <li>The program currently has 25 participants. In the next 2 months, 4 will have successfully completed the program.</li> <li>¼ pregnant women currently smoke</li> <li>Clients come mostly by referral, more are needed</li> <li>M. Ivory offered additional program support through Mercy REACH</li> <li>A. Kaup-Fett shared she has some incentive items she can share with the program.</li> </ul>	

<p><b>Education in Schools</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• K. Adams shared how the program was set up: 3 days/week about 4 classes each day (3<sup>rd</sup> grade). She would show an educational film and do activities with the kids including: letters to smokers, posters, etc. Kids responded well.</li> <li>• Challenge: Schools requesting classes at CCCHD's busiest times.</li> <li>• Group discussed getting an MOU in place regarding teacher involvement in the classroom.</li> <li>• The group is interested in getting education back in the schools.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ S. Dahlinghaus will discuss this with S. Bayless and C. Patterson</li> <li>✓ A. Kaup-Fett will research tobacco education requirements in schools</li> <li>✓ S. Dahlinghaus will collect tobacco use data by school district to determine highest need</li> </ul>
