Confirmed 3 goals with SMART objectives:	<p>Goals: 1) Prevention of unplanned pregnancies by offering early comprehensive education and access to birth control</p> <p>Objectives: 1a) Serve as a clearinghouse for sexuality programs, and create a grid/curricula checklist of all available programs in county (e.g., identify funder, evidence-based, provider) by July 2016 <i>(SMART: 75% of sexuality programs are identified and documented on Curricula Checklist with a 10-25% increase of awareness for community by August 2016)</i></p> <p>1b) Present “Curricula Checklist” to all Superintendents meeting (they meet monthly- see schedule at bottom of minutes*) at August 12, 2016 meeting at 7:30AM at ESC <i>(SMART: 75% of seven district superintendents increase their awareness by at least 50% at August 12th meeting)</i></p> <p>1c) Publish/print, distribute and post on websites the “Curricula Checklist” to community via identified sources by August 2016 <i>(SMART: At least 75% of sexuality programs are published, distributed and posted on websites available to the community by August 2016)</i></p> <p>2) Provide support in the first trimester of pregnancy by offering access to care and support systems</p> <p>2a) Continue distribution and posting on websites of “Prenatal Grid” <i>(SMART: 90% of prenatal programs are in English and Spanish, documented on “Prenatal Grid”, distributed and posted on websites from November 2015 and updated annually)</i></p> <p>2b) Research broader availability and distribution to undocumented persons and Spanish-speaking community contacts <i>(SMART: 50% of undocumented persons and Spanish-speaking contacts identify ways to increase availability and distribution by December)</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Task force members Sexuality education providers C.
