Pain Management in Relation to Potential Drug Addiction Discussion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dr. Marsh – Need for medical community to look at pain management without narcotics, 1 ER has reduce the use of narcotics for pain by 2/3. What methods/protocols have they put in place? Could we emulate this locally? A pain level of 0 (none) is not feasible when looking at addiction potential. What is the local Pain Management Center doing? • Amy Willman – We need to look at the cultural of pain, people are expecting no pain. Need to swing back to tolerable pain • Karen Murphy - Pain level is subjective making pain management more challenging. A mother with a normal vaginal delivery is now going home with a script for 30 days of Vicodin. • Wendy – Related a client testimonial regarding “pain is nothing compared to addiction”. • Educating the physicians is vital in regards to pain and addition. There is a need to find a balance between tolerable pain levels through effective pain control methods and patient satisfaction.

Grants and Monies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Wendy applied for and received a grant of \$48,000.00 over two years to purchase Narcan Project Dawn Kits. There is a tracking requirement with this grant which will allow for trends and vital statistical information to be observed/collected. Received \$1000.00 in support of Conversation for Change outreach program. This outreach event is held every other month and is for addicts. Each attendee receives a \$10.00 gift card. There are speakers to educate and agencies available to link those seeking help with services. Also, Project Dawn Kits are available for distribution. 	
Statistical Review	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Community Data – in 2015, based on DJFS referrals 126 babies drug tested positive at birth. Most tested positive for marijuana, followed by opiates. Please see handout for complete breakdown. The data for the first quarter of 2016 will be available soon. Age and race will be added to the data collection parameters. A system needs to be developed for comparing DJFS referral data to hospital data. Wendy to contact hospital regarding their stats. Suboxone contains an opiate and can cause withdrawal but is not tested for, this can skew stats. MAT Data – Vivitrol use is increasing with good outcomes and much improvement. Please see handout for additional statistical information regarding the MAT program. 	
Goals	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Goal discussion and planning scheduled for the May 27th meeting. 	
Coroner's Report	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Dr. Marsh – Drug Death Review, took until the end of March 2016 to compile all data and finish all of the 2015 cases. 73 confirmed unintentional drug overdose deaths for 2015, Fentanyl 49, Heroin 25, Alcohol 10, remainder attributed to various other drugs. As of February 22, 2016, there have been 12 unintentional drug overdose deaths in Clark County. The coroner's office is seeing an increase in use of cocaine with another drug. 	
Programs For Consideration	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Violence Interrupted – Peers who have overcome the effects of growing up in an environment of drug addiction focus on the mental health of young adults who are still struggling with issues of having grown up in a like environment. The goal is to mentor and break the cycle of violence stemming from lack of example and supervision as children. Brain Power Program for Youth – A science based program that is integrated into the science curriculum. Teachers view it favorably, especially since there is no interruption to class time. The goal is prevention and the program taught over a 3 year time period. Cost to be researched. Funding sources? Reach out to Cuyahoga County Drug Task Force and community participants regarding programs and initiatives they have in place. Cuyahoga has a multi-pronged approach to the drug abuse issue: prevention, awareness, community action an education. Dr. Marsh will specifically reach out to the Cuyahoga's coroner for ideas/suggestions. Unbroken Brain – premise that drug addiction is a symptom of a larger picture. Wendy will review to conceptualized and determine if we can use it.
