Community Outreach:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Wendy – presentation regarding myths of substance abuse, in particular stereotyping has been given to SRMC ER staff. Would like to go back and present again to catch any staff that missed the first time. Wendy would like to ask the Mother who spoke at the Mothers are Miracles day to speak to ER staff in the future. This would provide another voice and perspective from within our community. Wendy – spoke at the State House regarding what the task force is doing and used outreach information from birth drug and addiction data. Senator Coley is a big advocate of drug prevention and programs, very interested in Many Pathways, and want to use Clark County for a site visit. 	
Completed and Upcoming Event:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mothers are Miracles Day event was very successful. A point of particular interest addressed is the lack of treatment for drug addicted youth in Clark County. Conversation for Change, June 23, 2016 at Many Pathways. Promotional business size cards will be available 30 days ahead for law enforcement to distribute. Flyer will also be distributed 	
Discuss of Event:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Wendy will meet with Huma regarding feeding people who attend, the \$10.00 Kroger gift cards, mediation, recovery support specialist and community groups (law enforcement, insurance, bring in IHN, housing). Need to seek out more community support – hospital, mother/baby initiative and ER. How do we reach those who are being missed, those not already in treatment? \$1000.00 available through grant to buy gift cards but not money for food – will solicit donations Would the potential to reach those with addictions through Conversation for Change be better met by scheduling at different locations throughout the community (hosting agency would take care of hospitality) or staying with one location for consistency? At a future point, surveys will be distributed to help guide efforts. 	
Narcan Training:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Narcan training is available at Many Pathways on a daily basis. Can hands only CPR be added to the Narcan Training? 	
Dr. Marsh Update:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 15 drug deaths to date for review 16 confirmed deaths year to date. There is a low percentage of revival interventions performed by family members/friends in overdose cases. 	

Dr. Marsh Update continued:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Interested in matching coroner data with sheriffs data. Dr. Marsh will get with Gabe to look at statistical information from multiple sources and provide survival data to Wendy. Discussed the legalization of Marijuana and the effects it will have on the community. There appears to be an increase in the usage of Marijuana and Alcohol together. The effects are greatly amplified with used together. 	
Community Data	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Wendy to put dashboard together for the next meeting. Will do quarterly rather than monthly. Dashboard will include: Sheriffs data on the number of Narcan Kits they use; will look into getting EMS usage stats. EMS is difficult to track because there are so many, to check with Mr. Mowell, EMS Coordinator, to see if we can get stats; Baby born drug addicted; overdose deaths; Conversation for Change stats; impact tracking, SRMC detox unit will be operational by the end of June; Number of early releases from jail due to compliance with drug treatment, Vivitrol. 	
Treatment Update	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Treatment with Vivitrol has increased significantly while Suboxone is steadily decreasing. This is good since Suboxone has many more and worse side effects. Also, Vivitrol can be used for alcohol abuse. 	
Goals	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Youth evidence based prevention and potential initiation of treatment programs. Talk with Champaign County regarding their youth programs. Brain Power is not a good option – no expected outcomes. Check with Greta regarding services for youth, also research programs such as peer lead mediation as prevention. Peers Making Peace is an evidence based program with multiple expected outcomes. Adults would be trained first, then they would in turn train the youth.
