Medical Program	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Detox The new medical detox unit at SRMC is now open. Sherry will send out an overview and map for program unit. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Clients must be assessed and have a discharge plan, patients cannot just stop taking Suboxone. 2. No visitation, staff training needed to ensure follow through for this directive. Visitor can and often do sneak drugs into the patient. 	

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. Unit is not a walk-in service, must come through McKinley Hall or the Reach Program 4. Side discussion regarding getting Suboxone into McKinley Hall, details still need to be addressed. 5. Education regarding such topics as how manipulative addicts can be and not crossing professional boundaries. Lunch and Learn opportunity. 6. Communication options for educating the community on this new program. Newspaper? If an article is placed in the newspaper or if any other form of communication is used it must be made clear that there will be no admittance through the ED as well as covering any other limits of the program such as capacity of the program.
