CRT Madison County	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Roger Roberts –There is a Crisis Response Team (CRT) in Madison County. There will be a crisis training in Wilmington, Ohio in September. Will accept as low as 15-20 to hold a class. It is a 3-day training but can be broken up into 1 day per week for three weeks. Roger is one of the presenters. It is a certification course and offers 24 social work CEU’s. There are many CRT trained persons in Clark County. We just need to pull them in. There is also an Ohio CRT that sits on VOAD and responds through Victim Witness. The Red Cross also has a crisis team. Sue said that MH here in Clark County doesn’t have this training. They have 8 staff that have form a telephone tree and use that to report to situations. How is CRT program funded? Madison EMA does most of the funding. CRT is a one and done course you do not have to retake it. For liability coverage, CRT volunteers are asked to volunteer with the MRC. 	
Botvin	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Leslie Crew is meeting with Dr. Hill today to update him on Botvin and the FCFC meeting. Planning to meet with Dan Benton and then with the superintendents in August. There was good discussion at FCFC and everyone bought in to Botvin, Group agreed to focus on the middle school age group and allow a 3 year window. Hopefully, the talk with Dan will lead into discussion with the Superintendents, then getting a school willing to pilot Botvin. Three of our other Task Forces are in support of the implementation of this program. The 3 main areas are drug and alcohol, behavior and suicidal ideation. Botvin is very cost effective. Looking at various sources for funding. There is a drug prevention grant through the Ohio Attorney General’s Office The cost for the curriculum and to train one trainer is \$5000.00. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Leslie Crew to talk with Dr. Hill, Dan Benton and the Superintendents. <p>Pax</p>	<p>There is a plan is to expand PAX from 7 to 14 schools .Looking for data to come up with a measurable goal. How do they measure classroom improvement. The coaches do a baseline measurement before they implement PAX then measure outcomes at the end of same school year. Teachers are saying they use PAX and are able to have more teaching time. We need to be able to show an improvement so other schools can see the improvement. There is a baseline measure of the number of student disruptions. A count of number of disruptions is obtained. Another count is obtained at the end of the year to measure the decrease in disruptions.
