Community Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lunch and Learn presentation is scheduled for September 26, 2016 at Speedway Corp Offices. There will be two 30 minute presentations. • Planning is underway for an education event at Navistar • Conversation for Change – August 18th. 	
Medical Detox Programs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Work on the Medical Detox Unit - admittance through Mercy Reach has been problematic due to the fact that they do not have a subscribing physician who can prescribe Suboxone. Tramadol is being used but is opiate based and not a good choice. • Hospitalists are a group that need to be brought on board since they are the front line physicians within the hospital structure. Efforts to reach out to and bring the nurses on board must also be addressed. • There is a new physician, Dr. Oza who is able to prescribe Suboxone using standard protocols. • Opiates are still being prescribed for pain through the Birthing Center. Dr. Sani has developed protocols for pain relief in substance addiction situations without the use of opiates. Difficulties lie in bringing all staff on board with a different method of pain management. Dr. Sani is willing to be available to hospital staff if they have a patient in pain but opiates are not an appropriate choice of medicating. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Suggestion: wrist bands stating “no opiates be administered” be utilized as you would an allergy band. • Work with Dr. Sani in securing time at meetings to present and educate. Dr. Sani has sound supporting data to present: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Seek audience with the hospital Medical Directors first. ✓ Arrange for Dr. Sani to attend medical department staff meetings. ✓ Make connection with Dr. Johnson at SRMC for additional support. ✓ Facilitate a meeting between Dr. Kutwal and Dr. Sani. Dr. Kutwal is very supportive of prevention and treatment of substance abuse disease. He has been instrumental in program development. 	<p>Carey McKee will speak with Dr. Mike Mckee and help to facilitate a connection between Dr. McKee and Dr. Sani. Better connections, better implementation.</p>

Coroner's Report	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • January – May there have been 28 confirmed drug overdose deaths. Primarily from Fentanyl, Heroin and Cocaine. • Dr. Marsh introduced information regarding Carfentanil, one of the newest street drugs. It is significantly more potent than Fentanyl and may require up to 8 Narcan Kits to revive someone who has overdosed if it works at all. Narcan is frequently not effective. • Wendy shared information on Carfentanil received by McKinley Hall: The following segments are from communications received by McKinley Hall: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ CAUTION: I was in a meeting on Friday afternoon with local law enforcement who shared information about Carfentanil. There was an article in Saturdays DDN regarding Carfentanil (Summit County and Franklin County). Summit County alone had 91 overdoses and 8 deaths in the last 12 days. Carfentanil is being mixed with heroin and other opiates to increase their potency. This drug could migrate to Montgomery County and I want to ensure our staff are aware and taking the necessary precautions to stay safe. Staff conducting approved searches of clients property (personal belongings/ homes/vehicles) shall take universal precautions to ensure their safety and the safety of others. This drug is being used by heroin/opiate addicts. ✓ An intelligence communication out of Cincinnati over the weekend. Carfentanil is an analog of synthetic fentanyl. It is approximately 10,000 times more potent than morphine and 100 times more potent than fentanyl. It's intended use is for large animal sedation. We have not found it here as of yet but Columbus PD had (10) overdoses within a 9 hour period on Sunday July 9th. We have pushed this out to our folks and EMS. The information as to precautions is accurate.
