What are our expectations?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Decided on a three prong approach to Community Forums: Community Leaders, Medical Providers, Community.</li> <li>• April 5, 2017 set as the date for the first Community Forum. This forum will be directed to community leaders.</li> <li>• Forum ideal make-up: Law Enforcement, Mayor, Commissioners, Sheriff, Chief Moody, Allen Cox, DEA, FBI, Prosecutor, Community Investment Coalition, School Superintendents, Children’s Services, Attorney General, Judges, State Representatives, Hospital Administrator (Detox), Dr. Sani, Spiritual Leaders, Leadership Academy, and Media</li> <li>• Second forum make-up: Physicians, Pain Management Specialists, ER staff, Mental Health, Other Hospital Staff.</li> <li>• Creation of a standardized tool for delivery – Dr. Teegala will assist.</li> <li>• Sub Committee formed for pulling data together and organizing into a presentation: Carey McKee, Christina Downing, Wendy Doolittle, CCCHD EPI (Jessica Hamilton), Karen Murphy, Sonya Downing, Susan Bayless and Tina Fisher. First meeting February 28, 2017 at 9:00 AM.</li> <li>• Suggestions for inclusion in the message: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Show the financial impact, especially to community leaders. They are the ones who can initiate laws and programs and the bottom line is a motivator for leaders.</li> <li>2. Costs include: detox in jail, medical costs to jail, general medical costs, EMS/Narcan costs (CCCHD currently supplies Narcan to Sheriff Office, who usually uses 2 kits per overdose, then EMS/Hospital administers any additional doses (can be up to 16, average 8-10), cost of arrests, failed levy vs. impact of squad runs, cost of productivity, opportunity costs – new business will locate elsewhere, funeral costs – each cremation for the indigent costs \$850.00, and cost of grief.</li> <li>3. Offer CEUs to physicians to attend trainings. You will get a better turn out and response to good solid data.</li> <li>4. Discuss the missing continuum in the treatment protocol.</li> <li>5. Discuss drug addicted babies. Use stats.</li> <li>6. Prevention framework needed.</li> <li>7. Need to organize raw data in a manner that is useable and can be added to.</li> <li>8. Where possible put data into graph, visual depiction.</li> <li>9. Narcan is less expensive than overdose death.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>

Between June of 2016 and now there have been 126 assessments</li> <li>2. 90% of those state they are self-referred</li> <li>3. 114 made it to the bed</li> <li>4. 106 completed detox</li> <li>5. 80 only wanted to detox, did not enter into treatment</li> </ol> </li> </ul>
