<b>NOVA CRT/MRC</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Sandy has merged CRT, bereavement and LOSS team into one MH Intervention Team under the Medical Reserve Corps. CRT has been requested 4 times since our group first completed training last September. We have been very busy. The LOSS trained members responded to a suicide just last week. 2 of the LOSS trained members are also taking CRT along with Sandy Miller the last week of April.</li> </ul>	
<b>Community Crisis Management Plan</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>County school counselors still seem unaware of this plan. Different people have mentioned it at their meetings. Ken suggested having Scott and Mark hand them out. City schools have their own plan.</li> <li>Leslie is trying to get the text hotline posters in the school since you are not allowed to say the word "suicide" in the schools.</li> <li>Leslie will discuss the crisis plan with the school superintendents at their next meeting.</li> </ul>	Greta may be able to get the posters free for Leslie
<b>Resource List</b>  <b>Trauma Informed Care Workgroup</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Child Advocacy Center has hired a staff person to address human trafficking issues.</li> <li>Community Health Foundation Resource Guide is also a good resource. Diane VanAuker works closely with 211 for updates. She contacted Ken about adding an emergency preparedness piece.</li> <li>A group is working on the Community Strategic Plan: what are our goals and initiative</li> <li>Sue works with the city schools on their plans</li> <li>Working on more training or connection with groups</li> <li>Provide training for community members</li> <li>Creating a resource list.</li> </ul>	

<p><b>Botvin</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Miami View school counselor confirmed they are going to implement 2017-2018 school year in grades 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup></li> <li>• Tecumseh will implement in middle school using their own counselor and a few teachers</li> <li>• Trainer in Champaign County will train Clark County personnel. The MHRB is assisting with some funding.</li> <li>• 3 other trainers will be trained just to go out and help the schools as needed</li> <li>• Leslie Crew spoke with Amy about the update to the DARE program. It is an evidenced-based curriculum titled "Keepin' It Real."</li> <li>• Ken suggested we talk to the school Resource Officers about taking the Botvin training. Greta stated the Attorney General's office will pay to train Scott if he is willing to teach it.</li> <li>• Mr. Patterson will talk with Chief Moody and Sheriff Burchett just to see where they see things going with the DARE program.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>PAX GBG Plan</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Greta said funds from state gambling programs come back to the MHRB for prevention. Ohio is providing treatment dollars to locals but keeping prevention dollars at the state level for trainings. It just so happens they chose Botvin and PAX as programs for training. We don't know how that will benefit us on the local level.</li> <li>• Right now this is at no cost to the schools. WellSpring is currently funding the PAX program and has enough dollars to sustain it but not for expansion.</li> <li>• WellSpring is in the process of requesting more monies from the Board of Health. WellSpring will train their PAX personnel in Botvin also.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Handle with Care for County</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mental Health Services for Clark County is in a funded cycle.</li> <li>• Sue met with Chief Moody. He has given his approval and the presentation is ready but we don't know how we are going to get it out yet. She left him a message and is waiting for him to return her call.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Around the table</b></p>	<p><b>Ken Johnson</b> – When is the next YRBS? Sandy reported it will take place in the fall of 2017. The data will have to be collected and compiled before results are made available. Sue stated they will be available in 2 years. Montgomery county is doing an ICS structure for the opium problem. There hasn't been a fire chief's meeting in years. There is talk of starting that back up.</p> <p><b>Leslie Crew</b> – The Family &amp; Children First Collaborative is this Thursday and Pam will present on how to make referrals to her office.</p> <p><b>Pam Meermans</b> – OD's exploded over the weekend. 2 children were administered Narcan. We do want to go back through and see how we can change the referral process.</p> <p><b>Greta Mayor</b> – The Mental Health &amp; Recovery Board of Clark, Greene and Madison Counties in partnership with the Montgomery ADAMHS Board is providing a Youth Summit on Youth Led Prevention at Wright State on 04/26/2017. Have 400 youth attending. Adults from invited agencies will be in attendance as well. We want to be able to do this again,</p>

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not just a one and done deal. Youth Summit is geared toward the high school age, ranging from 14-21 years.

Opiate Epidemic – The MHRB approved funding for McKinley Hall to form a collaborative which will consist of an OD Intervention Team to provide peer support for those in addiction and debriefing for first responders. There is also a plan for a Safe House for those seeking treatment. Wendy will send out one licensed person with peers to a person who overdose. Wendy stated research shows a 30% engagement using this method. The collaborative will include Mental Health, SRMC, First Responders and Law Enforcement. Greta mentioned that she needs to meet with Sandy Miller about getting this group under the MRC.

**Sandy Miller** – Clark County exceeded their threshold for ODs twice since last Friday. A school nurse reached out to her after her own daughter died from a drug overdose. Her family is having a difficult time. The Center for Disaster Mental Health symposium will be on the Opiate epidemic this year. We hope to have Mike Dewine there to present on Ohio statistics as well as first responders to discuss impact on them, community task forces to talk about what they are doing in their communities and a success story from a recovering addict. The symposium is scheduled for 10/27/2017 at SOIN Hospital.

There is a suicide workshop this Friday in Columbus. A few of the LOSS trained MRC members are attending. The OCRT meeting will held be in Madison County next Friday.

**Kristi Limes** – Very thankful for this group. We attended Tracey’s training on Vicarious Trauma and it was very good but left use wondering what else we can do for this community. Our kids are doing a mural of a little girl catching lightening bugs. The concept is to bring light back to West Main St. Thursday April 27<sup>th</sup> we will be at the Senior Center from 5:00pm – 7:00pm to show the kids’ art work. Come and meet the kids. The kids will be working on the mural every Saturday through May so please stop by or honk and wave as we do the mural. The location is 1602 West Main St.- Solid Waste building.

**Sue Fralick** – A lot of change going on. Behavioral health has been redesigned throughout the state. It will change the face of what we can do. It changes how we bill and we are completely funded by what we bill. We don’t know all the changes because the changes are changing. Still working on the youth. Open access had its pros and cons. Some of the cons were the wait. They have gone to all appointments to ensure we are serving people in a timely matter. We will still take emergent cases as they come.
