We left it as a line to write in any of the Children's Hospitals we needed information from. • There was some confusion as to which form Ken referenced when he asked if the schools were using them and Sandy when she asked about signed MOU's. Ken clarified it's the form created for parents to take to the ED, physician or mental health counselor and back to the school for continuity of care. • The Crisis Plan is being used. • Only 10% of the members knew about this form • The plan is to use the new school year to reintroduce this form to the schools.

Mr. Patterson asked if we are researching other curriculum since Botvin is not evidence based for mental health. Leslie said that Botvin is evidence based and she will send the information to Sandy Miller. • The Community Health Foundation and United Way are providing supplemental funding for Botvin.

She feels the people who are dying by suicide are probably not utilizing the agencies where people are trained in QPR. Are the people that are trained in QPR not utilizing it or are physicians missing it? Chief Heimlich – if the adult GP medicates what are they missing? Sue stated for the group that the survey we are discussing is from the adult task force not this task force. This group agreed to bring the adult and youth task forces back together.
