Congestive Heart Failure (CHF)	CHF task force is unfortunately struggling however Springfield Regional Medical Center (SRMC) has hired someone in the quality care department and is continuing to train the individual. There have been a total of 9 referrals made to Rocking Horse Community Health Center (RHCHC) since January. SRMC is hoping to see the numbers go up once the individual is trained. There was much discussion regarding case management but has been a struggle with where to refer patients (health resource center or RHCHC). Brochures will be made to hand out to patients.	SRMC to continue to train the individual hired in the quality care department to specifically focus on CHF. Brochures to be distributed for patients
Diabetes	Recertification has been sent in. Plan A is to go as a multi-site. Legal has been spoken too and had some concerns so Plan B is in place for a back-up (RHCHC) to become an independent site after approved from the Board). RHCHC – RHCHC has seen their 1 st patient in the last two months for diabetes education and have had a couple referrals but are waiting to get certified.	Continue to investigate to which plan we will be using for RHCHC to become a Certified (American Diabetes Association) ADA site.
Asthma	Asthma is struggling in getting referrals. The community has been informed of Clark County Combined Health District (CCCHD) indoor air quality program. Pamphlets have been updated to inform the community of free supplies (pillow covers, mattress covers door mats, etc. and are hoping that this will draw in the community to call. Goal is to reduce Emergency Department (ED) admissions. There was a discussion to reach out to local pharmacies.	Task Force to continue to marketing information in physician’s offices, schools, etc. Task Force to continue to find an internal contact to get a valid report on ED admissions for Asthma. SRMC to run report for reason of visit from 0-18 years of age.
Oral Health	Community Health Foundation has provided RHCHC \$50,000 grant for the start-up costs for the dental clinic. These funds will also be distributed for two additional years. RHCHC has also received funds from a private donor (Shaker’s Family). RHCHC is looking at mid to late October before seeing their first patient. The clinic will only be open up to RHCHC patients for the first 6 months and will continue to expand to the community if necessary. Task Force is continuing to work on the Fluoride initiative. Fluoride will not be on the ballot this year due to 3 City Commissioner seats being open in November however, we are looking at putting it on the ballot in May of 2018. There was much discussion on the social justice issue of not having fluoride in the water. Many people do not have dental insurance and this is a great way to provide universal healthcare by adding Fluoride.	RHC to continue to interview dental providers and work with different consultants to fulfill the dental clinic. Continue to build on the committee and determine the plan on how to educate in Physician’s Offices.
Tobacco	Metropolitan Housing Policy has been approved by the Springfield Metropolitan Housing	Continue to build task force committee.
