Cardinal Health Update	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Cardinal Health Grant required the coalition to choose 4 of 9 deliverable tactics to focus their efforts on these goals. The Coalition chose tactics 1, 2, 3, and 5. These along with requirements of the other two grants will be incorporated into the overall strategic plan of reductions in the number drug overdose deaths , support of Treatment programs, Recovery Programs and Prevention: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Build or expand existing community collaborative to address the issue of opioid addiction: Completed by the hiring of the Coalition Coordinator. Implement and/or expand prevention education, i.e., Public Community Forum is one endeavor that meets this tactic/goal. Support clinicians as they reduce the use of opioids for all non-cancer related pain by implementing CDC and other guidelines. The Medical Forum being held in August is a first step in meeting the requirements of this tactic/goal Increase access to medication-assisted treatment and Narcan/Naloxone. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Dayton’s Substance Abuse Coalition is very supportive in sharing best practices and helping to facilitate programs in our community Carey was able to participate in a GROW Blitz (Get Recovery Options Working) Conversation has begun with the SPD to start a collaborative initiative where officers, peer counselors, and maybe EMS go out and knock on doors to share information, provide Narcan training on the spot. SPD’s Chief is on board after Meredith explained and asked for support. McKinley Hall will also be involved and Montgomery County with help get the initiative started. Community Collective Impact Model 4 Change (CCIM4C)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are in year two, which is the implementation stage. • Categories are utilized to develop goals. • The process involves mining the available data to establish the root and causal factors of overdose deaths. • The BHAG to address the underlying social cause and methodology for resolving. • The committee has been strategizing to determine how to meet the goals • The CCIM4C process is more intentional and purposeful than methods used to develop goals and strategies in the past. • There will be a CCIM4C webinar in the near future. • Rocking Horse Center is collaborating with MHRB in a steering committee to develop a pilot program for addressing trauma

If needed Tina will checked with the health department's medical supplier on cost of various sizes of needles/syringes
